Ms. Palestis' presentation included training regarding a Board Member's commitment to the community, the need to follow the chain of command and Board Policies, as well as the importance of maintaining confidentiality, the uses of social media, and avoiding conflicts of interest.

- Noecker News
 - Superintendent Somers delivered the Noecker News for Principal Greenwald, welcoming everyone back to school and into the New Year.
 - Student grade level meetings for Kindergarten through 6th Grade took place last week.
 Students have had an opportunity to reflect upon the past year, and make goals for the year ahead.
 - Auditions were held for the school play, *The Music Man*, and the cast list has been posted. Play practices will begin this week.

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- 6th Grade students will be receiving a visit from the West Essex Middle School counselors to prepare for the transition into 7th Grade.
- Upcoming events include: the Pre-K and Kindergarten Open House, the H.S.A.sponsored Bingo Night, Book Fair, and the Noecker Spelling Bee in Grades 3-5.
- A Class Parent meeting will be held Wednesday, January 10th, at 7:00 PM, followed by the regular January H.S.A. meeting at 7:30 PM.
- School will be closed on Monday, January 15th in observance of Dr. Martin Luther King Day.

• Superintendent Comments

- Ms. Somers congratulated the two new Board Members joining the Board for three-year terms.
- The first Ad-Hoc Board-Borough Committee meeting was held Friday, January 5th with Mayor Duthie and Borough Administrator, Maureen Chumacas, which built an understanding of the PILOT developments being pursued and their potential impact on the school district. A mutual desire to support the school community was evident and an open and positive dialog is anticipated as the projects move forward.
- This Friday, the Negotiations Committee will have a second meeting with the Board Attorney, after which, a meeting with the Roseland Education Association will be scheduled.
- Feedback on the district's Strategic Plan Action Plans may be given until January 15th. The Action Plans provide guidance towards implementation of the goals and objectives participants deemed most valuable for students, school, and community. Action Plans will be shared at the February Board of Education meeting.
- A Mindfulness professional development session will be offered to staff on February 20th.
- Principal, Robyn Greenwald is on the agenda for approval as the district's School Safety Specialist, as part of a state-mandated certificate program which includes coordinating with local law enforcement and continuing to evaluate the safety and security of schools.
- Finally, Ms. Somers congratulated the Board on school board recognition month, noting that the dedication and service of Board Members is greatly appreciated.

CODE OF ETHICS

a. I will uphold and enforce all laws, state board rules and regulations, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes should be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.

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- b. I will make decisions in terms of the educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools which meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
- c. I will confine my Board action to policy-making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the Board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
- d. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow Board members, to see that they are well run.
- e. I will recognize that authority rests with the Board of Education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action which may compromise the Board.
- f. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan, political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
- g. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. But in all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow Board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its schools.
- h. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
- i. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
- j. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on such complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
