## 5860 <u>SAFETY PATROL (M)</u>

The Board of Education recognizes the value of a school safety patrol as a means of preventing accidents, instructing students in good habits, and providing opportunities for leadership training.

The Board authorizes the establishment of a school safety patrol of students in Grade 6.

All eligible students may apply for appointment to the safety patrol. No student may serve without the written consent of his/her parent (s) or legal guardian(s). All applicants must acknowledge the possible hazards of safety patrol duty and agree that in the case of injury no liability will be attached to the Board or to an employee of the this Board. Selection among applicants will be made on basis of the applicant's demonstrated sense of responsibility, good citizenship, leadership capacity, maturity, and academic proficiency. Member of the safety patrol must attend a training program before they assume their duties. Safety patrol members shall serve for one school year. A member may be removed from the safety patrol for violation of school rules or failure to maintain the high standard of conduct expected of school safety patrol members.

Members of the school safety patrol may be assigned to control and direct student traffic on school grounds, on school buses, on sidewalks and paths adjacent to a street or roadway, and across streets and roadways. No school safety patrol member shall be permitted to direct or place himself or herself in the path of vehicular traffic.

All students shall be instructed to respect the authority of school safety patrol member in the performance of their duties.

No liability shall attach to the Board or any person holding office, position or employment un the Board, by virtue of the organization, maintenance or operation of a school safety patrol organized, maintained, and operated under the authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:42-1.
